Field Clinical medicine sciences (including development of drugs and medical devices)

Guidelines for Making a Nomination

Criteria

The nominee must have made an outstanding contribution to clinical medicine.

Selection

13 selection committee members and around 80 specialists from various fields within and outside Keio University will select laureates through a rigorous review process.

Nomination

- Individual nominators may make one nomination only.
- There is no limit to the number of nominations that institutions or organizations may make, but academic societies may make only a small number of nominations. In the case of making multiple nominations, nominations are limited to one nominee per research theme.

- Complete the online nomination form.
- The following attachments must be attached to the online nomination form to comprise a complete nomination package.
 - 1. Copy of 3 to 5 major publications
 - 2. Nominee's curriculum vitae (including date created)
 - 3. Nominee's bibliography
 - 4. Description of nominee's research achievements in relation to nomination

Deadline

Nominations for 2017 must reach the Keio University Medical Science Fund Office by March 7, 2017.

Please note

- A nomination should be made for one researcher only. We do not accept group nominations.
- Nomination materials will not be returned.
- Nomination materials will be used exclusively for the selection process and will not be used or disclosed for any other purposes.
- Nominators will be informed of the results at the end of September, after final decisions have been made.
- Queries about the status of the selection process will not be answered.
