The Keio Medical Science Prize 2026 (31st)

Objective	The Keio Medical Science Prize recognizes the outstanding and creative achievements of researchers in the fields of the medical and life sciences, particularly those contributing to scientific developments in medicine. It aims to promote worldwide advances in life sciences and medicine, to encourage the expansion of researcher networks throughout the world, and to contribute to the well-being of humankind.
Field	<u>Basic medicine, clinical medicine, or life sciences closely related to medicine.</u>
Eligibility	<u>Nominees must be currently active in their field of research and be expected to make future contributions to the field.</u>
Prize	The Prize will be awarded to two laureates; one domestic, one abroad. Each laureate receives a certificate of merit, a medal, and a monetary award of 10 million yen.
Ceremony	The award ceremony is scheduled to be held on or after November 2026 at the Keio University School of Medicine, Shinanomachi Campus, Tokyo, Japan.
Deadline	Nominations must reach the Keio University Medical Science Fund Office by <u>March 1, 2026</u> . Please refer to the guidelines on the following page for more details.

Call for Nominations

Guidelines for Making a Nomination for 2026 (31st)

1. Selection Criteria

- The nominee must have made a breakthrough in medicine and the life sciences, or a related field.
- The nominee must have made an outstanding contribution to basic and clinical medicine.

2. Selection

Selection committee members and specialists from various fields within and outside Keio University will select laureates through a rigorous review process.

3. Eligibility

Nominees must be currently active in their field of research and be expected to make future contributions to the field.

4. Nomination Criteria

- 1) Individual nominators may make one nomination only.
- 2) There is no limit to the number of nominations that institutions or organizations may make, but academic societies may make only a small number of nominations. In the case of making multiple nominations, nominations are limited to one nominee per research theme.

 - List of 5 major publications (including DOI)
 - Nominee's curriculum vitae (including date created)
 - Nominee's bibliography

6. Deadline

Nominations must reach the Keio University Medical Science Fund Office by **March 1, 2026**.

- **A nomination should be made for one researcher only. We do not accept group nominations.**
- Nomination materials will not be returned and be used exclusively for the selection process and will not be used or disclosed for any other purposes.
- Queries about the status of the selection process will not be answered.
